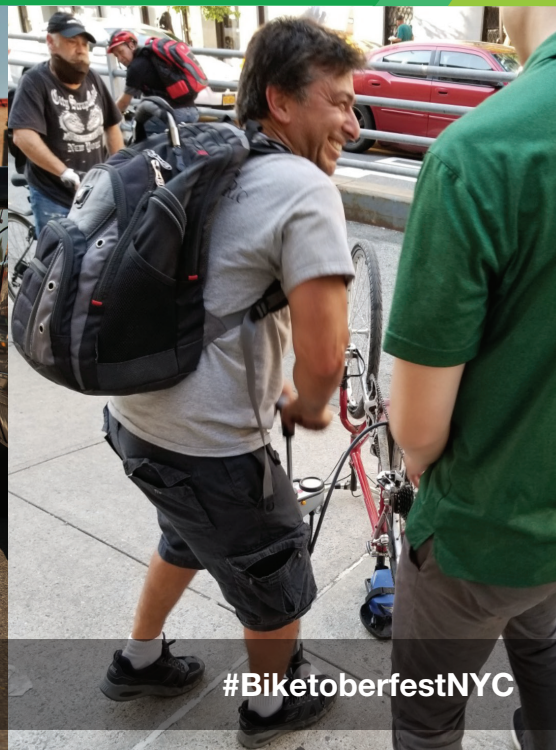


Get Pumped for October Bike Month!
